Persimmon trees are native to the southeastern United States. They produce round, orange fruit, around 1-2" in diameter, with a honey-like flavor. This variety also has distinct, blocky, dark grey bark, adding a touch of visual interest to your landscape. Small to medium sized tree found on a variety of sites. Produces sweet, edible fruit. Popular wildlife food source.

- Bears fruit in 4 to 9 years.
- Attracts small animals, birds, white-tailed deer, foxes, and black bears.
- Produces white to greenish-yellow blooms in the spring.
